Our Vital Signs Report has now been published and provides a snapshot of our Community vitality, identifies significant trends and supports action on issues critical to quality of life in Temiskaming. This was a major project, and it could not have been completed without the support of NOHFC and FEDNOR grants. This allowed us to employ Cherry Wong and Julia Bigelow, two amazingly talented people, to coordinate the efforts under the guidance of our equally talented Executive Director Claire Hendrikx. This report provides information to be used by all Community partners to make our Community an even better place to live and prosper. It is the responsibility of us all to use this information wisely.

2021 was a challenging year with Covid shutdowns and the inability to meet in person but our committees continued to complete their due diligence and our Foundation distributed over **HALF A MILLION DOLLARS** to Community partners. And we are on schedule to provide grants in 2022 well in excess of this number.

We could not enjoy the success to date without the continued and compassionate support of our caring community of Donors. Your confidence in our mission and your generous giving to establish new funds and contribute to existing funds keep us growing and able to give more and more to our Community partners.

We had five Board members leave this year. Mark Wilson, Louise Philbin, Chris Oslund, Rod Mathews, and Paul Crombeen provided their considerable efforts to ensure a continuing legacy and we thank them for their service. New Board members are listed in the back of this report, and we look forward to working with them.

I look forward to furthering the work of the Foundation with our staff and the dedicated Board of Directors into 2022 and providing grants to aid in the sustainability of our great Community partners.

2021- Still living through a pandemic

As we go to press, we continue to tackle the COVID-19 pandemic.

Winter of 2021 saw continued attempts to gain control over the spread of COVID 19. Vaccines started rolling out in the province in January 2021 with residents in long term care facilities being among the first people to receive them. Another wave of the virus started in March and was followed by a third provincial state of emergency which closed schools. Delta variant raised its head in the Summer, and we responded with second doses of Pfizer, Moderna and Astra Zeneca vaccines. Early December saw a large uptick of cases locally, with some hospitalizations and unfortunately, three deaths. As we neared year end, the Omicron variant arrived, the most contagious yet! Our community experienced the highest COVID 19 numbers since the start of the pandemic.

Local groups providing front-line services, have been and are experiencing increased demand and must continually adapt programming and service delivery to ensure they are meeting current public health guidelines.

COVID-19 has revealed cracks in society through which those experiencing vulnerability have fallen. It is those most vulnerable community members who have been disproportionately affected by both the virus itself and the impact of the related restrictions.

Survey participants were asked to rate the issue areas based on the scale pictured to the right.

Ratings were then converted to a numerical scale, with 5 being "Excellent". The average rating is used in the report to compare across issue areas.



NEW FUNDS – 2021

Juergen Leukert Scholarship Fund



In March 2021, we lost Juergen Leukert, an entrepreneur, farmer and DSBONE School Board Trustee for 25 years. Mr. Leukert valued hard work and giving back – he had been an active Kirkland Lake and Kerns Lions Club member as well as being involved in the development of the Kirkland Lake Soccer League. The Juergen Leukert Scholarship Fund for Students in an Apprenticeship

Program, will provide an award to a TDSS graduating student who is pursuing an apprenticeship in a licensed trade who exhibits a sound work ethic and integrity.

Kristin Heasman Fund



In July 2021, we lost Kristin Heasman, a woman who loved life, had a great sense of humour, was a hugely supportive aunt and a great friend. Kristin was a very kind and generous person whose life was devoted to developing her students' self-esteem and full human potential. She leaves behind a lasting legacy through her impact on changing mindsets about individuals with disabilities.

Kristin's family established the Kristin Heasman Fund in her honour. This Donor Directed Fund will be administered by her parents.

Bud & Gwen Colquhoun Fund



In July, we lost Bud Colquhoun, one of the Town of Englehart's most well known citizens and prominent community volunteers. For many years, Bud was the author of the Englehart Echoes column in the Temiskaming Speaker. He was a

driving force in the restoration of the '701' Steam Locomotive. Bud received a Certificate of Lifetime Achievement from the Ontario Heritage Trust in appreciation of his 'lifetime of volunteer work to identify, preserve, protect and promote our province's rich heritage'. In his will, Bud directed his residuary estate to The Temiskaming Foundation's Community Fund. The Executors of Bud's estate established the Bud & Gwen Colquhoun Fund.

Giving to Your Community Foundation

Your local community foundation is a charitable non-profit organization that contributes time, leadership and financial support to initiatives that benefit your community most.

DONOR

Anyone can become a donor and gift a small or large amount of money to a community foundation.

DONOR ENGAGEMENT

Community foundations and donors work together to determine what community activities the money can support.

MAKE A CONTRIBUTION

Community foundations work with the donor to establish a new endowment fund or give to an existing fund.

INVESTMENT

The donor's gift is pooled with a community foundation's endowed assets, invested through careful stewardship and income is used to make grants.

GRANTS

Community foundations distribute grants to all corners of the community, based on the needs of the community and the priorities set by the community foundation.

COMMUNITY IMPACT

The community foundation invests in many ways — grants, building partnerships and pooling knowledge, resources and expertise to stimulate ideas and strengthen community.

- ✓ **Expertise** | Community foundations are credible partners. They are people with expertise in financial management and granting.

FUNDS & GRANTS 2021

The Temiskaming Foundation was established to make this region stronger by supporting charitable activities taking place in the community. The aim of the Foundation is to fund projects across a broad range of interests, including the social services, arts and culture, education, health and physical fitness and amateur sport.

In **2021, over \$510,000** was distributed to community groups.

COMMUNITY FUNDS

The income from these funds may be used for any community program at the discretion of the Board of Directors. Community funds allow the Board to respond to the community's most pressing needs.

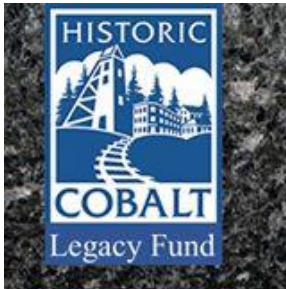
