Fund Types

Endowment Funds

An endowment fund is created when a donor’s gift is permanently invested rather than granted out all at once. The income from investments is then granted each year to support causes the donor cares about most.

Donor Advised Funds

This type of fund enables ongoing donor participation in the distribution of income from the fund. The donor can make recommendations on granting.

Restricted Fund

In this fund type, the donor designates recipient charities in the fund agreement. Grants are made automatically to designated charities each year.

Agency Fund

A fund held by a registered charity which designates annual proceeds to be granted back to the charity.

Scholarship Fund

New Funds launched in 2025

Allan Haarala Memorial Bursary Fund

On March 17, 2025, Allan Haarala passed away leaving behind an incredible legacy for the people of Cobalt. Born in 1940 at the Cobalt Hospital, Allan grew up in Cobalt, attending teacher's college in North Bay, before returning to dedicate his life to teaching. When he lost his home in the fire of 1977, he rebuilt the next year. A private man, who spent his time writing stories, he was a dedicated member of the Cobalt Legion and honest to a fault. He left behind a legacy that will provide a significant scholarship to a student from Cobalt, but also supported the Bunker Military Museum, the Paul Penna Cobalt Public Library, the Cobalt Mining Museum, the RCL Branch 44, the Food Bank, the Salvation Army, the Diabetes Society, the Temiskaming Hospital, and the Town of Cobalt to purchase equipment for the municipal park. His dedication to his community will live on.

Earlton Gospel Hall Cemetery Fund

This Agency Fund was created by the Earlton Gospel Hall Cemetery Board, with an initial donation from Barry Potter, to provide ongoing support for the maintenance of the Earlton Gospel Hall Cemetery.

Hal Brown Memorial Fund

A lifelong resident and farmer in Dymond Township, Hal dedicated the majority of his life to the Temiskaming area agricultural community. He was especially passionate about sharing his love of farming and animals with young people. This fund will enable his family to continue to support young people in the Temiskaming District who are interested in sustainable agriculture and rural development, including but not limited to scholarships for students aged 18 to 30.



Haileybury Food Bank Fund

This Agency Fund was created by the Haileybury Food Bank Board to ensure long-term support for the Food Bank for generations to come. The Food Bank is open every week on Thursday mornings and provides Christmas Hampers for registered participants each year. The Food Bank is a registered charity, reliant on the generosity of donors to ensure its continued operations. In 2025 they served 113 households per month, increasing from 103 households in 2024. This endowed fund will provide annual grants to support the costs of operating the Food Bank.

TAG - Open Studio Libre Fund

This Agency Fund was created by the Temiskaming Art Gallery, who started the TAG - OSL fund with the assistance of our committed Board, staff and friends. The Temiskaming Art Gallery is very active in Temiskaming and without the community's support, we wouldn't be able to carry out our projects, activities, and events. We want to ensure we have a space for people of all ages to come and create, our Open Studio Libre is that space!

Allan Stewart Francis Estate Fund

Allan Stewart Francis passed away in 2018, leaving behind a legacy to the Temiskaming Foundation in his will. In recognition of this donation, the Board of Directors of the Foundation created a named fund in his honour. His generous contribution will support project grants from the Community Fund for nonprofit organizations throughout the entire District of Timiskaming.

Marilyn & Robert Nobes Fund

Marilyn Mae Nobes passed away at the Temiskaming Hospital on May 25, 2023, at the age of 86. Born in Cobalt, Marilyn was married for 55 years to the love of her life, Robert James Nobes. Marilyn's dedication to her community was exemplified by her many years of serving on the Board of Directors for the Timiskaming Church. Marilyn also loved to spend time on needlework and working on puzzles.

Robert passed away in 2018 at the age of 77 in their home in Haileybury. He worked for Inco Falconbridge Sherman Mine and Bruce Power as an Instrumentation Technician until his retirement. He loved beekeeping and "puttering at the homestead".

Both Marilyn and Robert were people who touched the lives of all who knew them. They left behind a legacy, supporting the Food Forever Fund, For Kid's Sake Fund, Historic Cobalt Legacy Fund and the School Nutrition Fund/fond d'alimentation saine pour les élèves. To recognize this donation, the Board named a fund in their honour.

Zack's Crib Homelessness Prevention/fond de prévention de l'itinérance de Zack's Crib

This new restricted endowment fund, made possible by the Zack's Crib Crisis Centre Board of Directors, will invest donations from our community to support homelessness prevention projects in the Timiskaming District.

After the closure of the shelter, the remaining assets were transferred to the Temiskaming Foundation to create a Fund to continue to support the homeless population. A community-based committee has been created to review grant applications from eligible organizations, with the first intake for applications in 2026.

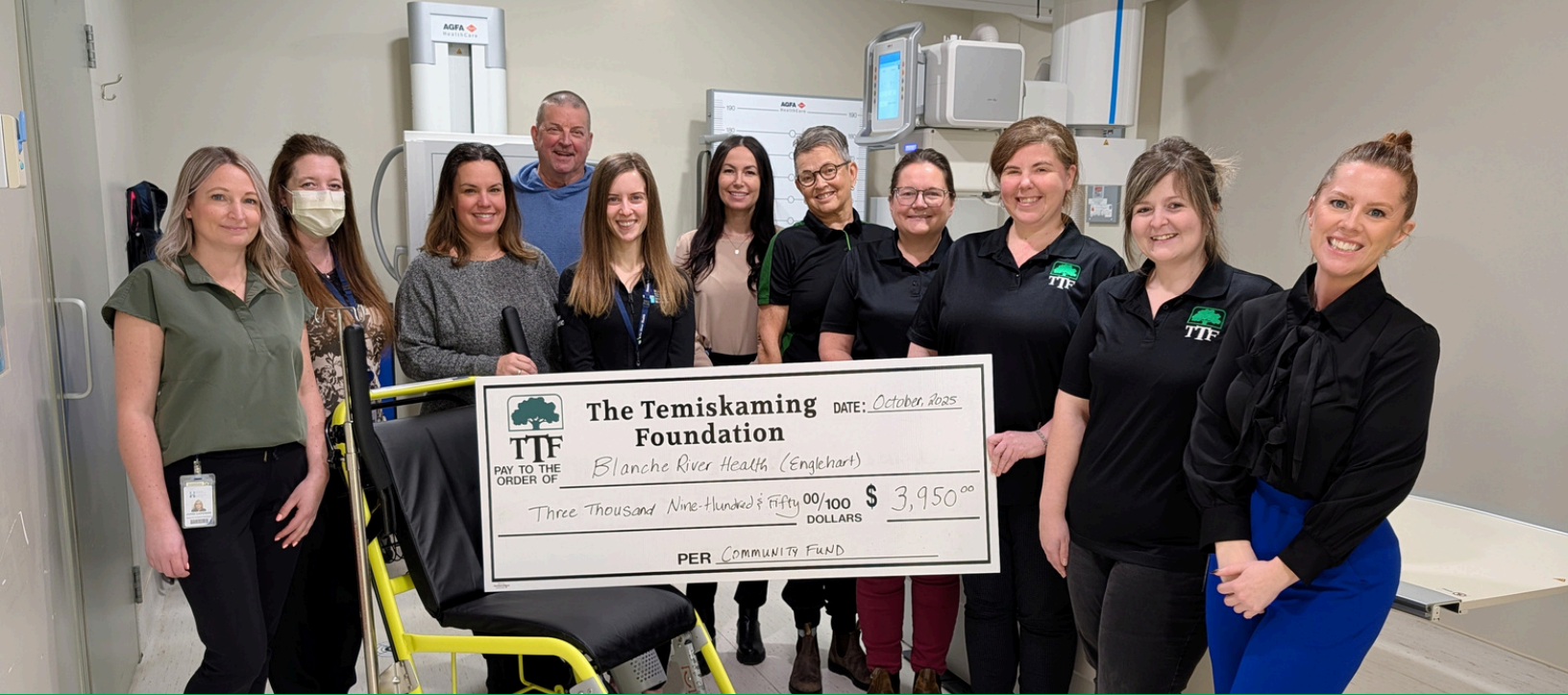

In 2024, the Temiskaming Foundation created the School Nutrition Fund, with support from the Leonard A. Wilson Fund, the Patricia Willard-Inglis Memorial Fund, the McLean Fund, and dozens of individual donors. In 2025, it made its first grants. Open to all schools in the District of Timiskaming, fifteen schools received funding for breakfast, lunch or snack programs, helping more than 3700 students.
